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
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Thank You for a Great Year!



What if Nobody Came to Your Funerals?

ou might consider this a silly notion. Or maybe you've been seeing this trend

for years. But the traditional methods for informing the community that someone has died – the newspaper death notice has fallen victim to the overall decline in newspaper circulation and readership. This presentation will discuss those trends, and examine new methods for getting the word out in the community and beyond. Should your funeral home consider using social media tools like Facebook and Twitter? How can these tools improve attendance at funerals, rather than replace the ritual of funeral service?

Paving the Way:

A First for Virginia Cemeteries

ucked among rolling hills in the Shenandoah Valley, the Duck Run Natural Cemetery is giving way to green, in more than one way. The ecofriendly cemetery is the first of its kind in the state of Virginia and among a new trend in the United States.

As Virginia's first natural burial ground certified by the Green Burial Council, and the Commonwealth of Virginia, Duck Run Natural Cemetery offers only 100 percent ecology friendly burials.

"Our cemetery provides a new option for burials in Virginia," said Ken Kyger, president of Duck Run Natural Cemetery. "Over the years I have learned the difference between a growing fad and a trend and as I see it, this is a trend. We are looking forward to growing slow and steady as the years come and serving our clients and meeting their needs."

When Kyger opened Kyger Funeral Home & Crematory in1975 he saw a growing trend in cremation. In 1979, cremation was at approximately six percent across the nation, but in the Shenandoah Valley, where Kyger Funeral Home & Crematory resides, Mr. Kyger



said the trend was maybe one percent. As

he reflected on his experience of 30 years ago, Kyger said people thought he was crazy when he put a crematory in. Years later, cremation now makes up half of his business.

"When you see things happening around the world, you need to think to yourself, 'Is that a trend or a fad." Kyger said. "That's what we did when we put in our crematory, and it has served us well. Now, we feel the same about natural burial."

Mr. Kyger explained the cemetery has two main concepts, natural burial and total land restoration. The natural burial, he said, is already partially integrated into traditional burials as an immediate burial. A complete natural burial ground is a step beyond that, and Duck Run Natural Cemetery will take it that extra step.

In a natural burial, the bodies are generally not embalmed. If they are embalmed, there is only one embalming fluid available in the market right now that is non-toxic to the environment and it's available only through the Champion Company. In addition, all of the

caskets are biodegradable and made with renewable sources. For example, caskets are made of wicker, bamboo and sea grass or if they are wood, they are pine or poplar with no varnish or lacquer; the inside is pure silk, or pure linen with no dyes or other synthetic materials.

"The idea of the casket is that it doesn't do anything to delay the natural decomposition of the body," said Kyger.

To keep in line with the second purpose, total land restoration, all of the landscaping in the cemetery are plants that are indigenous to Virginia. The landscaping follows the natural growth patterns of the land so that as the cemetery matures it will look more like a park or arboretum with plants growing in the

natural habitat.

For those looking for a natural alternative, Duck Run Natural Cemetery has already paved the way.

Legislative Summary

The General Assembly adjourned sine die Saturday, March 10th at 9:30 p.m. During the 60 days legislators spent at the Capitol 1,616 of the original 2,876 bills introduced were approved.

Here is a summary of some of the bills. For a full summary, go to www.vfda.net.

Business

This session saw the passage of workers' compensation exclusion for policies where jurisdiction falls under either the Longshore and Harbor Workers' Compensation Act of the Merchant Marine Act of 1920.

General Laws

Several bills providing a preference in the state government hiring process for members of the Virginia National Guard and spouses and children of veterans who were killed in active duty were adopted by both chambers.

Conversely, bills seeking to amend the Virginia Public Procurement Act to allow a preference for businesses established in the same locality as the contract or those employing local residents for the work failed to report.

Social Services


A bill to shorten the window in which vital records, including birth, death, marriage and divorce certificates, become public is expected to become law.

Taxation

Disabled veterans and their surviving spouses will now receive property tax exemptions due to legislation that passed this year.

Elections

Voter identification requirements eliminating sworn statements as basis for casting provisional ballots passed the legislature.




